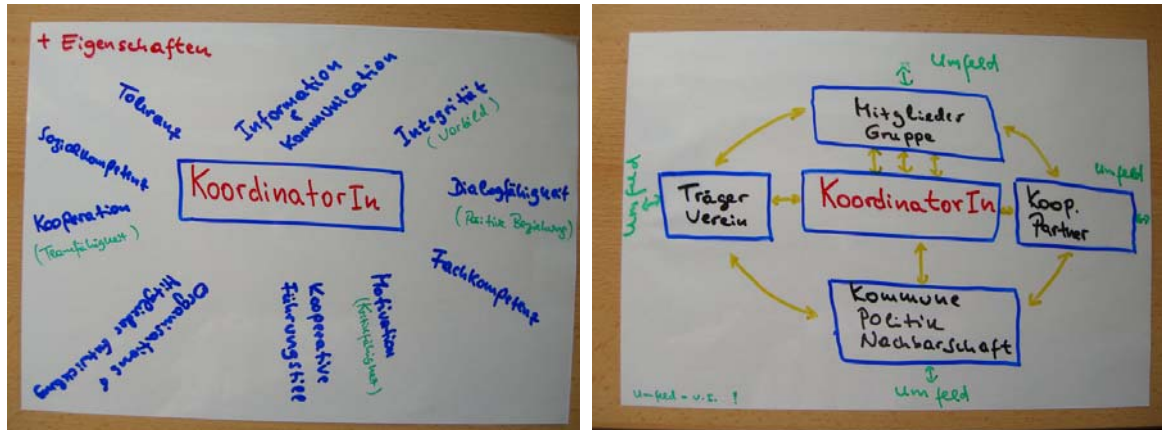


2. Coordination of the Garden Project



The coordination of an intercultural garden is a very important task. Someone (or a team) must be the driving force, recruiting and contacting people, someone has to give impetus, conceive ideas, provide a group framework, invite to meetings, make inquiries, encourage. Tasks wait to be shared, but not all can and want to contribute to the same extent and not all have confidence in their abilities. It is a matter of communicating both inwardly and outwardly.
